These other parties are not the "Applicant". However, "ownership" is generally synonymous with control unless otherwise stated (no other statement regarding control of Breezy Meadows appears to have been submitted). Therefore, my objection is the application may not be sufficient to bind the actual controlling party/parties in interest to the obligations and limitations recited in the application. If my concern is true, then the County may not have the protections it needs to enforce the terms of the proposed permit if the actual controlling party fails to comply, directs Breezy Meadows to act inconsistently with the application, or breaches the agreement thus adversely affecting the persons the zoning ordinance is intended to protect. In other words, who is really calling the shots? These types of relationships are very intricate and often the subject of sophisticated intercompany agreements. The absence of such documentation, and corresponding information, being provided to the Board of Appeals I believe is inconsistent with the intent of the ordinance thus rendering the application incomplete. The Board and the citizens of Knox County are entitled to full disclosure of all relevant information concerning the Applicant. Transparency, I believe, or lack thereof, is popularly used to describe these circumstances. As it stands, I believe the application fails to demonstrate the transparency required of the Applicant.

Description: This change order modifieds the Contract Price to authorize additional work items. Each item is summarized below:

I. The following additional work was authorized by the Owner:

Alternate Valve Actuator

An alternate valve actuator for the shutoff valve in VMH-1 (near the connection to the existing system) has been added in lieu of the current electric actuator. It was discovered that the current electric actuator on order does not close automatically with power loss, which could allow leachate to back up into the Lift Station Manhole LS-1 and overflow in the event of a power failure. The alternate valve actuator will close on power failure. This actuator is a net increase of cost \$15,235.

Addition of Cleanout Section

A modification to the start of the Gas Header pipe capped end near Station 34+00 was made to include a vertical riser to bring the pipe above grade. A cleanout pipe was also be added for future pipe access for line jetting. A riser section for the 3-inch air line was also added. MTE to furnish and install additional fittings and piping on a T&M basis. The total T&M cost was \$12,544.39.

Flanged Spool Piece

A 10-foot section of flanged gas header pipe was added to the pipe installation near the low point near Station 41+40. This flanged section will allow future tie-in to the line for condensate removal in a future project while easing construction efforts for the tie-in. MTE to furnish and install flange adapters, backing plates and bolt assemblies. Straight run of pipe will be paid out under Optional Bid Item C. MTE to furnish and install additional fittings on a Time and Materials (T&M) basis. The total T&M cost was \$4,650.

Addition of Cleanouts on the Gas Header

The addition of three (3) cleanouts will be placed along the gas header allowing future jetting and camera access in the event of future pipe maintenance. This field adjustment was discussed with Knox County and verbal approval was received on June 1, 2024. The change order request for labor and materials by MTE is \$10,500.

II. The following Contract Adjustments are to be executed:

Change Order 2 referenced a previous Change Order No. 1 that was not previously authorized. The details were for supply of expedited electrical panels for \$3,500. The value was referenced on Pay

Applications 1 and 2. The electrical panels were expedited due to the very long lead time of this item and are in the electrician's shop at this time for integrating into the work. The fee for the expedited panels was \$3,500. This amount is incorporated into the Contract Price as Change Order 1.

The net increase to the Contract Price for Change Order 3 is \$42,929.39.

Background:

This project is located at the southeast corner of Lake Bracken, just north of Hillbrook Estates on TR 52. The existing drainage structure was built in 1974 and it carries traffic over a tributary of Brush Creek. The structure consists of two (2), nine (9) foot diameter corrugated steel culvert pipes. The Illinois Department of Transportation completed an in-depth inspection on this structure on September 2, 2021. Both culverts have rusted through at several locations along the waterline. The existing drainage structure is limited to legal loads only.

The new drainage structure will be a cast in place concrete box culvert consisting of three (3) 12 ft x 12 ft barrels, 101 lin. ft. in length.

Bids for this project were opened on June 17, 2024. There were four bidders. The lowest responsible bid, in the amount of \$1,464,417.50, was submitted by Brandt Construction Co., Milan, IL. The Engineer's Estimate was \$1,473,922.50.

Budget Impact: This project will be funded with \$800,000 in Township Bridge Program funds, with the remaining \$664,417.50 split between Cedar Township and Knox County. The funding for this project is included in the 23/24 County Bridge Fund budget.

Agenda Item: Approve invoice for new tandem dump truck cab & chassis.

Background: In early 2023, large truck manufacturers were struggling to meet the demands. Many of the manufacturers were focusing on the production of over-the-road semi chassis instead of chassis for vocational dump trucks. In February of 2023, Quincy Mack reached out to me and said they were hoping to be allotted some chassis build slots from MACK and would we be interested in one. With the uncertainty in the market at that time I committed to a potential build slot that Quincy Mack was offering. At that time, the cost of the new chassis or the actual delivery time was still uncertain.

In June 2023, Quincy Mack informed me we did receive a build slot but delivery date and final cost were still uncertain. In October 2023, Quincy Mack informed us the chassis would be built in May/June of 2024 and the cost would be \$140,527, based on the specifications we provided.

It occurred to me this week I have not presented this to the county board for approval of the purchase. This is a Sourcewell price so the bidding requirement has been satisfied.

Budget Impact: The purchase of the tandem cab & chassis was included in this years budget.

Recommended Action: Approve invoice for new tandem dump truck cab & chassis.
